

#### Oakwood Community Contribution: Oakwood, Part of Westmont's 100 Years

This year we are celebrating the 100th anniversary of Westmont which was incorporated on November 10, 1921, with a population of approximately 400 residents. Until 1833 the Potowatomi Native Americans lived in the area now known as Westmont.

In 1872, in the aftermath of the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, William L. Gregg found the region to have good clay for brick-making and founded the Excelsior Brick Company. Gregg also chose this area because it was the highest mound between Chicago and the Mississippi River on the CB&Q line, which he used to haul bricks to re-build Chicago. Czech, Polish, and Italian workers settled in a new neighborhood named Greggs. Two schools and a train depot called Gregg's Station or Gregg's Milk Station were built. The Gregg brickyard was abandoned after 1900, leaving only the Gregg home and a few surrounding farms as most of the workers and their families departed.

In 1919, real estate developer Arthur McIntosh bought land in Westmont and offered working-class Chicagoans an opportunity to own property for a \$5 down payment and small monthly installment payments. By 1923, his subdivision had more than 1,800 residents, many first or second-generation Austrian, Polish, or German-Americans. At first, these new landowners lived in tents and shacks. They had neither paved streets nor utilities. Soon they built cottages.

On November 10, 1921, the village incorporated as Westmont.

#### **OAKWOOD**

The Oakwood subdivision area that we call 'home' was annexed by the Village of Westmont in the early 1970s. What we call "Oakwood" was part of a 900-acre farm that had been purchased by the Healy family in 1936. The Healy farm went from Cass Ave to Rt 83 and from Ogden Ave to 35th St. On the farm was a dairy barn which Healy converted into a horse barn, including an indoor arena for the hunters and jumpers he stabled there. According

to Don Healy, "there used to be a bridle path that went completely around the farm which you could ride for a couple of hours without crossing paths." Healy also kept horses there for the U.S. Army. In the early 1950s Healy farmed his land, growing corn and beans and raising cattle. During the period before the barn was torn down in 1985, it was used as a horse stable, housing polo ponies and sponsoring indoor polo in the winter.

Over the years, the farm sold off acreage for new In 1972 Miller developments and businesses. Developers built the first houses in what is now the Oakwood subdivision. All of the model homes were on Independence Avenue with other houses built in 1973, 1974, 1975... until the recession hit. This also changed the plans of building homes where the townhomes and Oak Brook Toyota are currently located. Houses with lake front property were custom-built homes, i.e. not one of the model homes. Only a few houses were built by Miller in the 'Phase 3 section', i.e. between the schools and 35th St. There was no building activity for a few years until 1985-86 when U.S. Homes built about six houses. Then Montalbano Homes built about 80% of the houses in that section; some were custom houses.

CUSD #201 became official on July 1, 1972. Before the high school was built, students in Westmont went to either Downers Grove or Hinsdale; residents wanted something for Westmont kids to be proud of. Westmont Junior High School was built in 1974, before which students in junior high attended Central School (now Manning School). Construction and planning for Westmont High School started in 1973; it opened in 1976. Until students could get into the high school for classes, they had class at WJHS.

The architect who built the high school also built IMSA (Illinois Math & Science Academy) in Aurora, which was modeled after WHS. The school was built in a circular configuration; when it first opened, classrooms were blocked off with movable partitions. Later, permanent walls and doors were

### Home Security Cameras & Sharing and Assistance For Emergency Responders


In the March 2021 issue of <u>The OAK LEAF</u>, the Oakwood Neighborhood Watch group reported information on various Home Security Camera systems.

During the June 15th "Conversation with Sgt Weibler" (presented by the Oakwood NW), information was shared about a partnership with the police department called the "S.A.F.E.R. Program"



The Westmont Police Video Sharing and Assistance For Emergency Responders

(S.A.F.E.R.) program's goal is to help identify and log public-facing cameras within the village. This voluntary program is a partnership with businesses and residents to help better serve our community. Participant's personal information is held securely by Westmont public safety staff.



"With citizens and businesses registering their camera locations, it can help significantly speed up the investigation process," said Sergeant Tim Radtke. "We hope the more camera locations we have on file, the better chance we have of solving crimes and keeping the community safe."

## DuPage County Encourages Proper Leaf Management this Fall

DuPage County Stormwater Management (SWM) is encouraging DuPage County residents to dispose of leaves properly this fall. When leaves blow into storm sewers and waterways, they can become a source of water pollution. In just six to eight weeks, leaves can account for more than half of annual phosphorous in stormwater runoff, which may cause algal blooms and be detrimental to fish and aquatic insects. Leaves can also build up along streets and block storm drains, which can lead to localized flooding. Residents can avoid these issues by composting, bagging and mulching leaves.




## **Oakwood News: Quarterly Market Outlook**



Hello Oakwood.

Fall has finally arrived after a hot summer and an even hotter housing market. It's a sellers' market, it's a sellers' market. Ask just about anyone how the last six months of the housing market have been and

this is what they will tell you. It's a sellers' market. Although this is entirely true due to escalating home prices fueled by the low inventory of homes on the market, there are many reasons why buying now may be in your best interests.



## Two Reasons Why Waiting A Year To Buy Could Cost You

If you're a homeowner who's decided your current house no longer fits your needs, you may be hoping that waiting a year might mean better market conditions to purchase a home. To determine whether to buy now or wait, we need to ask ourselves two simple questions:

#### What will home prices be like in 2022?

Three major housing industry entities project continued home price appreciation for 2022. Here are their forecasts:

Freddie Mac: 5.3%Fannie Mae: 5.1%

• Mortgage Bankers Association: 8.4%

Using the average of the three projections (6.27%), and the average selling price of a single family detached home in Westmont over the last twelve months, \$390,992, that home would be valued at \$415,507 by the end of next year. That means if you delay it could cost you more. A prospective buyer could pay an additional \$24,515 just by waiting.

#### Where will rates be by the end of 2022?

Today, the 30-year fixed mortgage rate is hovering near historic lows. However, most experts believe rates will rise as the economy continues to recover. Here are the forecasts for the fourth quarter of 2022 by the three main entities mentioned above:

Freddie Mac: 3.8%Fannie Mae: 3.2%

Mortgage Bankers Association: 4.2%

That averages out to 3.7% if you include all three forecasts, and it's nearly a full percentage point higher than today's rates. Any increase in mortgage rates will increase your cost.

#### **Bottom Line**

When asking if you should buy a home, you probably think of the non-financial benefits of owning a home as a driving motivator. When asking when to buy, the financial benefits make it clear that doing so now is much more advantageous than waiting until next year.

## Westmont News: From the Village Board



Hello neighbors! I hope everyone has enjoyed their summer and all the fun events in town. Lots of things happening at the Village. Here are a few key updates and initiatives...

#### **Westmont 100th Anniversary Celebration**

On November 10, 2021, the Village of Westmont will celebrate its 100th Anniversary of Incorporation as a municipality in the State of Illinois at Village Hall.

There are several special activities including the unveiling of the Future of Westmont mural by artist Fanny Moy, 100th Anniversary Trivia Contest, pictures with 100th Anniversary Mascot Garrett, the debut of the 100th Anniversary History Video, and the dedication of the new James Addington Plaza near the train station. There will be several keepsakes commemorative including 100th Anniversary Beanie Babies, anniversary commemorative ceramic plates, special anniversary coins that will be given away as contest and raffle prizes.

The event will also include the presentation of the 100th Anniversary Westmont Legacy Awards, which will include a listing of businesses that served Westmont for 50 or more years. The Legacy Awards will also include a special presentation to specific families in which generations of the same family served the community for multiple decades.

The final anniversary event of the year will be on Saturday, December 4 when the annual Holly Days Parade will incorporate a 100th Anniversary theme. More events details will be published closer to the event date.

#### **Westmont Fire Offer Hurricane Assistance**

Earlier this week, the Westmont Fire Department was one of several agencies from Illinois that set out for New Orleans, Louisiana to assist with the aftermath of the recent hurricanes in that area. The emergency personnel from Westmont will be living in tents at a remote site for a total of 17 days. They

will be assisting local jurisdictions with flooding problems, search and rescue operations, and other concerns relating to the hurricane.



#### **Drug Take Back Day**

On Saturday, October 23 (10AM – 2PM) the Westmont Police Department will participate in the National DEA-sponsored Drug Take Back Day. The drug takeback program provides residents with a safe method of disposing unwanted, unused, and expired prescription drugs. This year, there will be three locations: the Westmont Police-Fire Facility at 500 N. Cass Avenue, Westmont Fire Department, 6015 S. Cass Avenue, and Mariano's, 150 W. 63rd Street in Westmont.

To participate, residents will bring their unwanted drugs to one of the three locations. Participants will stay in their vehicles as they drive through the collection area. Members of the Westmont Police Department and event volunteers will be on-site to receive all medications delivered and ensure safe disposal of these drugs. Following is a list of items that will and will not be accepted during the collection:

#### **ACCEPTED**

- Pills, powders, and patches
- Liquids, creams, and inhalers are accepted and should be packaged separately
- Needles and/or sharps MUST be secured in a Sharps container to be accepted during this program

#### NOT ACCEPTED

- NO radioactive medicines
- NO EpiPens
- NO loose Sharps

The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day addresses a crucial public safety and public health issue. According to the 2019 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 9.7 million people misused prescription pain relievers, 4.9 million people misused prescription stimulants, and 5.9 million people misused prescription tranquilizers or sedatives in 2019.

#### Free Leaf Collection in November

As part of the contract between the Village of Westmont and Waste Management, there will be free leaf collection during the month of November beginning Monday, November 1 and continuing through Friday, November 26. Residents will be allowed to put out unlimited kraft paper bags of leaves free of charge next to their garbage on their scheduled garbage pick-up day. Only kraft paper yard waste bags can be used for this free program. This program is for leaves only; grass clippings and other yard waste materials will require a yard waste sticker.

#### YARD WASTE PICK-UP & STICKERS

From April until December, the Village offers a yard waste pick-up program. Residents can put grass clippings and other yard waste into kraft bags for pick-up; each bag of yard waste will require a yard waste sticker. Yard waste stickers can be purchased at Village Hall, 31 W. Quincy Street; Bales Ace Hardware, 20 E. Quincy Street; Mariano's, 150 W.

63rd Street; and Jewel-Osco, Cass & Ogden and 55th & Holmes in Clarendon Hills.



This was the opening message from the president of the OHA in Vol. 1, No. 1 of the Oak Leaf newsletter, April/May, 1986. The president of the OHA was the First Resident of Oakwood, Roger Westman. The Eastern Shoreline of Lake Charles, which is OHA property and open to all residents, was obtained on our behalf largely by Roger's efforts. The fence that was constructed along Ogden for the homes on the South end of the neighborhood were also due in large part to his push, and of course, Westman Beach was named after both Roger and his wife, Nancy, who were joint Citizens of the Year in Westmont in 2010. The bench at Westman Beach is dedicated to Roger's memory.

Congratulations, Westmont, on 100 years! It is great for Oakwood to be a part of this community.


