Chief among those are the fact that homes with fewer residents don't need such large cans, and that for those with mobility limitations these 96 gallon behemoths can be a hazard, especially in the winter months if driveways are slick. Waste Management worked with the Village to replace the 96 gallon cans with 64 gallon alternatives, which was coordinated through the OHA (you should be aware of this if you're on our e-mail list). Whether or not a 32 gallon alternative will be made an option is yet to be heard. If so, we'll let you all know (\*ahem\*... e-mail list).

Then we have the "whatever happened to..." category.

- 1.) FEMA, after a few years of running silent, decided that now would be the time to reinitiate the completely illogical reclassification of some homes around Lake Charles as being in a Flood Plain. There's no rational reasoning behind this change... had hurricane Harvey hit Westmont full force, then maybe, and while I'm no meteorologist, I have to think the likelihood of that happening ever is fairly remote. We've sustained multiple "100year storms" in the past 10 or so years (may need to rethink that name), and never had a real problem. While things came up again, there hasn't been any real motion yet.

# Oakwood - Lake Management Committee

Hello Oakwood Neighbors,

During the month of July Lake Charles experienced an uncommonly large blue-green algae bloom that covered parts of the lake. Just in case you missed it, blue-green algae blooms typically appear as surface scums or clumps floating in the water (which can look like grass clippings or curds of green cottage cheese), or simply a strong florescent green color cloud in the water. Very often, they are also accompanied by foul odors that resemble septic, fishy, or petroleum-like smells.

While blue-green algae are a naturally occurring component of all aquatic ecosystems, large or frequent blooms are not. This summer the lakes and ponds of the Midwest saw an unusual amount of large and frequent blue-green algae blooms as a result of an unusually wet and rainy early summer period, and unfortunately Lake Charles was no exception. The unusual high levels of rain combined with nutrient rich runoff materials and rising temperatures made July and ideal environment for these unusual blooms.

Blue-green algae have the ability to produce toxins that can be harmful to both humans and animals if exposed to skin or consumed, so contact should be avoided. The OHA Board and Lake Management Committee utilize a lake management company that consistently monitors the health of the Lake Charles, including its algae levels. In consulting their expert advice regarding the treatment of a large blue-green algae bloom, the immediate and

widespread use of algaecides to kill off such blooms is not recommended as doing such would release any toxins the algae are carrying as well as deplete the water's oxygen levels, both of which would have a detrimental impact on the Lake's ecosystem. In our case, the recommended course of action was to let the algae run their natural life cycle and get washed away with the next heavy rain, which is what happened about a week later.

Since July there have not been any additional large blooms of blue-green algae in Lake Charles and the Lake Management Committee is working with the lake management company in seeking alternative treatment techniques to target phosphorous and other rich nutrients that are the underlying cause of these large and frequent blue-green algae blooms. These new treatment techniques would be utilized the next time the conditions are favorable for another large algae outbreak.

I hope everybody enjoyed their summer.

### Westmont News: From the Village Board



Hello neighbors! I hope everyone enjoyed all the community events that go on in Westmont throughout the summer. A big thank you to the Oakwood residents who volunteer countless hours to help make the events possible. Below are a few updates on items

addressed at the Village Board and upcoming events.

#### **Stormwater Management Program**

During a recent village meeting, the board authorized the issuance of \$7M in general obligation bonds specifically for stormwater infrastructure projects. These bonds are exclusively funded by the non-home-rule sales tax adopted by referendum. These bonds will allow the village to continue to make significant progress in upgrading infrastructure. The bonds cost approximately \$500K annually which leaves about \$900K annually from the same funding source for additional ongoing maintenance and projects.

### **North Westmont Fire Protection District Consolidation**

Throughout the past few months, Westmont and DuPage

County have been working with the unincorporated residents located near the northwest corner of Cass and Ogden in the North Westmont Fire Protection District. For as long as I can remember, these 536 parcels have been receiving fire and paramedic services from the Westmont Fire Department at a cost less than what actual residents pay. With the support of DuPage County, the Village Board and the unincorporated residents, we successfully began dissolving the district. Ultimately, eliminating the need for the village to offset an annual shortfall of approximately \$70K.

### **Shred Event for Special Olympics**

The Westmont Police Department along with Docu-Shred are hosting a paper shredding event to benefit Special Olympics Illinois. Residents can bring any paper materials that need to be shredded to the Westmont Police Station (500 N. Cass) on September 23<sup>rd</sup> from 9AM – Noon. Suggested donations are \$5 per container of paper. This is a great way to clean out your office and help out a worthy cause!

## Westmont News: From the Westmont Planning & Zoning Commission



Planning & Zoning seems to come in spurts and while the last several months have been relatively slow, several major projects are on the horizon. Taken together, these projects represent significant investment, planning and exposure for our Village.

They also will play a major role in defining our community over the next several decades.

June and July both had the Ryan Companies on the agenda for the massive property space on the NW corner of Pasquinelli Drive and Oakmont. Fronting both sides of the road, Ryan is a big player in the development scene and promptly went after Caterpillar. As the space was not move-in ready, Caterpillar went elsewhere. They continue to look at this space with either single or multi-tenant utilization and the full upgrade required for the tenant.

We also saw in July a new annexation from unincorporated Clarendon Hills. Coming in at R-1, we approved a recommendation to reduce to R-2 which is more in keeping with the homeowner's lot size. The homeowner displayed beautiful plans for a major home build project on the site with the full intent to make it his residence.

August saw a 55<sup>th</sup> Street resident request a variance for a 6 foot privacy/safety fence. Located along a busy thoroughfare, this is a request that we have approved many times in the past. Key components are keeping sightlines open for folks traveling through the alley as well as for the homeowner as they exit their driveway onto 55<sup>th</sup> Street. We also gave a recommendation for

a downtown business to relocate from LaGrange and establish a Day Spa complete with interior space for Ladies' Nights Out!

Several large scale projects are currently underway in Westmont and here are short updates on some. Porsche and BMW are both well into construction on their new facilities. When completed, each will be drastically expand their footprint, create updated facilities and hopefully, increase contributions to our sales tax base with greater auto sales. Porsche may also be expanding their presence at the old Alpha Motors site at Blackhawk and Ogden.

I mentioned the Ryan Companies above as they currently seek tenants for a re-design of the entire property at Pasquinelli and Oakmont.

The major expansion approved by the Village Board last fall for the Oak Brook Hills Hilton has been delayed by legal proceedings brought on by residents of the townhomes located on the property. Settlement rumors continue to circulate and a few weeks ago, the Natatorium was given final approval by the Village Board. Look for revised plans in the near future. The Village of Westmont website publishes periodic updates on the progress of this project.

Rumors continue to swirl on the south side regarding several of the large properties located near 63<sup>rd</sup> Street and Cass Avenue. As often is the case with large acquisitions, due diligence requires non-disclosure agreements and results in all kinds of rumors only one of which usually occurs. We'll keep an eye on things and report back in future issues if there are any updates!



Finally, with an eight story mixed use building proposed for the NE corner of Cass and the Burlington Railroad, our downtown may have the cornerstone for redevelopment. Included within the building will be commercial space, 3 floors of internal parking along with five residential floors. A complex project involving the relocation of the downtown S-turn, a new parking structure for downtown visitors would also be constructed as part of the plan.

The Village of Westmont Planning and Zoning Commission meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00pm in the Village Hall. All meetings are televised live on local cable access channel 6 and then replayed at 10:00am Monday through Friday. Agenda items are then sent to the Village Board with the comments of the Commission for final disposition. You can also view the agenda on the Village website www.westmont.il.gov. The next meetings will take place September 13<sup>th</sup> & October 11<sup>th</sup> – tune in!

# Westmont High School Continues to Thrive

In 2013, Lisa Hootman, Westmont High School science teacher, facilitated a garden project. Over the years it has been a popular activity for the high school students and an outdoor learning lab.

This year, the students have harvested about 500 pounds of produce from the garden and are hoping to reach 900 pounds by the end of the fall. They have donated 350 pounds of produce to the Peoples Resource Center to date.

In addition, Nate Chamberlain, Westmont High school science teacher, added a bee hive and formed a Bee Club. The students harvested 30 pounds of honey a few weeks ago which is an exceptional amount for a first year hive. They are planning to add two more hives in the spring. The local pollen and nectar sources appear to be plentiful, keeping our WHS bees happy.

# CUSD 201 Early Childhood Program Receives Gold Circle of Quality

For the fourth year in a row, ExceleRate Illinois award-

ed the CUSD 201 Early Childhood Program the Gold Circle of Quality. This is the highest recognition an early childhood program can receive.

ExceleRate Illinois is a statewide quality rating and improvement system designed to make continuous quality improvement an everyday priority among early learning providers. The program establishes standards for helping infants, toddlers, and preschool age children develop intellectually, physically, socially, and emotionally. It provides a framework for early learning professionals to identify opportunities for improvement, increase their skills, and take steps to make positive changes.

The Gold Circle of Quality recognizes programs that

meet or go beyond the highest quality goals. Gold Circle programs have met the highest quality standards in three areas: learning environment and teaching quality; administrative standards; and staff training and education. Programs are actively engaged in continuous quality improvement.



Jack Baldermann, Westmont High School Principal, has been named one of three finalists for the 2018 National Association of Secondary School Principal Award. Jack has cultivated a culture of safety and compassion that has led to skyrocketing student achievement. His school was one of 500 nationwide that were chosen in 2015 by Newsweek for "Beating the Odds." All African American and Latino students have graduated on time, four years in a row, and the number of underrepresented AP Scholars has increased by over 700 percent. Since 2015, the school has been the most improved regular high school in the nation on the Washington Post Challenge Index (and ranked top 1 percent in the state). The staff describe feeling supported by Baldermann, who has led them collaboratively in building ambitious, student-centered programs based on the school's vision and S.M.A.R.T. goals. On top of faculty support and student success, Baldermann also be-

lieves in mentorship, having served as lead mentor to over 40 principals in 14 states. Additionally, in his 25 years as an administrator, 21 of the educators he hired and mentored for their first administrative position have gone on to become successful principals and superintendents. The winner will be named sometime in the fall.

# Westmont High Continues to Achieve Unprecedented Success

Each year the Washington Post publishes the Challenge Index which ranks the most challenging high school in Illinois and nationally. This year the Washington Post ranked Westmont High School as the fourth most challenging high school in the State of Illinois. The highest ranking the High School has ever received. Nationally the high school ranks 191 out of 28,000 high schools, which puts Westmont in the top 1% of high schools in the country.

Westmont High School also boasts a 99% graduation rate. In the last four years, the graduation rate for African American students and Latino students has been 100%.
